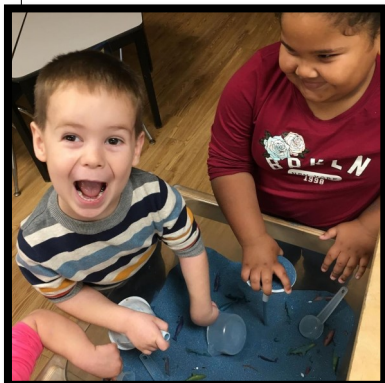

THIS MONTH IN KINDERGARTEN!



Throughout the month of November the students in Mrs. Nutbrown and Miss Grinton's class have been investigating spiders. We've been asking lots of great questions about what spiders eat, how they spin webs and where they live. During our inquiry we found out that spiders have 8 legs and 8 eyes, some are venomous, and many other interesting facts. We spun webs in a variety of ways using yarn, created spiders from playdough, and painted some amazing

spider pictures and wrote about them. Such great learning happening!

In Ms. Claydon and Ms. Walker's class the Drama Centre turned into a Pet Shop and we learned a lot about different kinds of pets and how to take care of them. We invited families to share their pets with us and we met lizards, a tortoise, cats, and a dog! Pets became the basis for our artwork, playdough activities, and creative writing. We also introduced measurement concepts by using cubes, stickers, toothpicks and popsicle sticks to measure various lines.

If you would like to contribute anything to our class this month, we are in need of food colouring, flour, and salt for making playdough. We also



love to receive "beautiful junk" which means things like small empty boxes, ribbon, string, interesting packaging, thread spools, corks, etc. These kinds of open-ended items are great to inspire creativity!
